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## <u> Transnational Identities: Theory, Text and Criticism</u>

Globalization with its better opportunities has created a new class of expatriates and immigrants. They are trans-nationals who are in between dislocation and relocation, between centre and periphery, between past and present, like passengers in transit between cultures; always in search of identity. They have synthesized the paradoxes for their success. Being the citizen of the multination, they are the 'Trishanku', the 'Nowhere man', having many roots like a Banyan tree they are rootless, ambassador and refugee simultaneously. Being global in outlook, they are local in habits and have become 'Glocal'. The world literature has been enriched with multiculturalism, post-nationalism, post-colonialism, post-modernism etc. by Diasporeans.

The Indian Diaspora writings can be categorised into two groups. The first group of migrants belongs to those who have spent a part of their life in India and are literally displaced. They carry their cultural bag with them which makes it difficult to assimilate with the host culture. Racial discrimination, hostile conditions and cultural onslaughts make it difficult to survive whereas academic and materialistic prospects make it more difficult to return back to home land. Being torn between two polarities they develop a sense of in-betweenness, a sort of 'hybrid', 'diasporic identity', always in a state of flux. This identity crisis can best be seen Edward Said who defines it as a sort of 'hybrid'. For Rushdie they are 'wounded creatures' with 'fractured perceptions'. Salman Rushdie, Bharati Mukherjee, Vikram Seth, Rohintan Mistry, Anurag Mathur and others belong to this group. The second generation of Diaspora writers belongs to the educated elites of India, born and brought up outside India, migrated to developed countries like the USA, UK, Canada & Australia. They are doctors, engineers, financial experts, writers and media people who enjoy the privilege of being a proud Indian community. They are global Indians in spirit and soul. Being twice or thrice removed from the reality of India, they make an easier conversion from the past Indian culture to the materialistic western culture. They are in a love-hate relationship with India. They view India from outside considering it as exotic and wonderland. Kiran Desia, Jhumpa Lahiri, Ram Chandra Adiga and others belong to this group.

The national seminar intends to project the achievements and struggles of the trans-nationals. The purpose is also to search a new aesthetics, a new approach to understand and interpret diaspora literature. Sub-themes for the seminar are:

- 1. Diaspora and post-colonialism
- 2. Diaspora theories
- 3. The literature of the first generation diaspora
- 4. The literature of the second generation diaspora
- 5. Women writers of Indian diaspora
- 6. Children's literature of Indian diaspora
- 7. Non-fictional writings of Indian diaspora

#### **Paper submission:**

We invite papers related to the thrust areas with the concept note of the proposed national seminar. The research papers should conform to MLA style (seventh edition). Presentation time will be of fifteen minutes. #### About The Institute
